What is Upcycling Day?

24th June 2023

Upcycling day is an international celebration of repurposing old items and upcycling them so that they are not wasted.



What is Recycling?

Recycling is the process of destroying waste and repurposing it to make something new from it, e.g. scrap metal is melted . Processed , and then used to make a new item
